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PROGRAMS DURING THE ACADEMIC SESSION.

Curriculum Enhancement: Review and update the existing curriculum to ensure it is up-to-date, relevant, and aligned with industry trends and standards. Incorporate feedback from stakeholders and integrate innovative teaching methodologies and technologies where appropriate.

Faculty Development: Provide professional development opportunities for faculty members to enhance their teaching skills, incorporate new teaching methodologies, and stay updated with advancements in their respective fields.

Student Support Services: Strengthen student support services such as counseling, academic advising, and career guidance to ensure students receive comprehensive support throughout their academic journey.

Quality Assurance Mechanisms: Implement quality assurance mechanisms to monitor the effectiveness of curriculum delivery and student development programs. This may include regular evaluations, feedback mechanisms, and performance indicators.

Technology Integration: Leverage technology to enhance curriculum delivery and student engagement. This could involve implementing learning management systems, interactive online platforms, or virtual learning environments.

Collaboration and Partnerships: Foster collaborations and partnerships with industry partners, research institutions, and other educational organizations to enrich the learning experience and provide students with opportunities for practical exposure and internships.

Continuous Improvement: Establish a culture of continuous improvement by regularly reviewing and refining curriculum delivery and student development programs based on feedback, evaluation results, and emerging trends in higher education.

Communication and Transparency: Ensure clear communication and transparency regarding the quality initiatives being implemented, as well as the outcomes achieved, among all stakeholders.
